Judith B. Collins Distinguished Professorship (F5318)**

**Position:**

This is a tenure track position (F5318) at the rank of Associate or full Professor. The initial appointment is for a term of three years with the possibility of review for reappointment. This professorship was established to recognize extraordinary excellence in nursing and will support a distinguished nurse scholar who will promote the mission of the School of Nursing, including taking an active role in the community of scholars as well as in the Richmond community. It is anticipated that the faculty member's community work will be in the context of women's health or primary care nursing.

**Qualifications:**

- Doctoral degree in Nursing or a related field, with one graduate degree in Nursing
- Graduate degree in specialty of appointment
- Eligible for appointment as Associate or full Professor in the School of Nursing
- Record of external funded research in the area of women's health or primary care nursing
- A defined track record of peer-reviewed publications and funding to support the scholarship
- Demonstrated leadership responsibility and excellence in nursing practice, research, service, and teaching in women's health or primary care nursing
- Demonstrated ability to participate in a community of scholars
- Excellent oral and written communication skills
- Currently licensed or eligible for licensure to practice nursing in Virginia

**Desired Qualifications:**

- Nurse Practitioner

**Responsibilities:**

- Maintain an integrated academic life in teaching, research and service within the department and School
- Participate in all aspects of the nursing program, including teaching across program levels (undergraduate and graduate)
- Participate in curriculum planning, implementation and evaluation
- Maintain a funded program of research in the area of women's health or primary care nursing and disseminate knowledge
- Participate in service and practice related to the area of scholarship
